 to the test of abstinence (dancing, of course). Even though Carolyn and I packed our binders with definitions and had them out in plain sight, we did not provide very much time for review and reinforcement. Sunsets, mai tais, and water aerobics in the pool seemed more appropriate. I'm sure it will all come flooding back, but how quickly is the key question! Going without a workshop or dance for a month really begins to frighten you. However, I know that the Trailblazers will welcome us into their squares and help us get back up to full speed. Carolyn and I experienced this feeling of inadequacy in June at the Friday Trailblazer C3A dance called by Mike Jacobs. We attended in order to help provide refreshments. Instead of sitting and observing the dance, we were immediately thrown into a square in order that three couples didn't have to sit out. Feelings of panic and helplessness rushed back, similar to those we experienced at our first Plus, Advanced, and Challenge dances. I'm sure the feelings are the same that many dancers feel when they attend their first few Trailblazer dances, or when they have been absent for a while. The C3A dancers were wonderful. They deliberately included us in strong squares and made sure we were positioned for the greatest chance for success. There were moments when calls that I was comfortable with and thought I knew just didn't transfer from the brain to the feet. And at times the transition from teaching tape and class calling speed to actual dance speed seemed like a quantum leap. But we did it! Carolyn and I went home worn out, but exhilarated - our first C3A dance was a huge success. The most encouraging thing is realizing that experienced dancers can have such a big impact on less experienced and newer dancers. The encouragement, guidance, friendly advice, and involvement of those dancers made us feel truly welcome. This lesson holds true for every level. Knowing how important their help was for us makes us that much more appreciative of how important our help is for visitors and newcomers to our Trailblazer dances. We should do all that we can to help others.

As you read this newsletter, you will be enjoying the calling of Anne Uebelacker, one of Canada's

premier caller ambassadors. Her August dance starts the fall Trailblazer dances in earnest. ## DANCE REVIEW

Mike Jacobs was the featured caller for the June Trailblazers weekend. At the C-3A dance session, Mike presented an interesting mix of calls from unfamiliar positions and challenging applications of concepts: (1) from an eight chain thru -- Catch Motivate 3; (2) from infacing lines -- Exchange The Boxes 3/4; (3) from same-hand interlocked diamonds -- Inside Triangles Exchange The Triangles; (4) from a formation formed from a completed double pass thru and having the leaders Quarter Out -- Reach Out; (5) from parallel ocean waves -- Stretch

Reach Out; (6) from parallelogram inverted lines -- Parallelogram Drift Apart; (7) from parallelogram inverted lines with the ends of each line facing in with a center right-hand box -- Parallelogram Eight By Mini Chase; (8) from infacing lines -- Stable Travel Thru; (9) from parallel ocean waves -- Checker-box Circle To A Wave; (10) from parallelogram ocean waves with the outermost ends facing in -- Initially Triple Box, In Reverse Order, do the Centers Part of Rally; (11) from offset right-hand two-faced lines with the leaders in the center line -- Initially Triple Lines, 1/2 Tag Motivate; (12) from a formation formed from parallel right-hand single-file columns and having the leaders of each box Quarter In -- Initially Triple Box, Tally Ho; (13) from outfacing lines with the boys as belles and the girls as beaux -- Own the Boys, Twist The Line by Bend The Line; (14) from parallel 3&1 lines with infacing centers and with ends with their left hands in -- Own The Centers, Square The Bases by The Gamut; (15) from infacing lines -- Split Phantom Lines Trip The Set.

At the Saturday A-2 workshop session, Mike provided the dancers with a review of a wide variety of calls, many from difficult starting formations: (1) from a formation formed from a static square and having everyone Quarter Left -- All 8 Peel & Trail;

(2) from parallel ocean waves & parallel two faced lines -- Trail Off and Peel & Trail; (3) from parallel ocean waves -- Peel The Top; (4) from parallel columns with boys facing and girls back-to-back -- Boys Start Half Breed Thru; (5) from a double pass thru -- Checkmate The Column; (6) from various parallel 3&1 lines & inverted lines -- Crossover Circulate; (7) from point-to-point diamonds -- Triple Trade; (8) from same-hand point-to-point diamonds -- Split Counter Rotate; (9) from a tidal two-faced line -- Fan The Top; (10) from infacing lines -- As Couples Wheel Thru; (11) from infacing lines -- As Couples Recycle; (12) from a formation formed from a right-hand tidal line and having the very center 4 Wheel & Deal -- As Couples Centers Start Left Swing Thru; (13) from a formation formed from parallel two-faced lines and having the leaders As Couples Quarter Out -- Do Your Part Mini Busy; (14) from parallel 3&1 lines with infacing ends and a center right-hand box -- Coordinate; (15) from a formation formed from parallel single-file columns and having everyone 1/2 Column Circulate and in the new center columns of 3 the #1 dancers Run and the very center 2 U-Turn Back -- Those Facing Start Chain Reaction.

At the A-2 dance session, Mike used some of the calls from the workshop session, but had plenty of additional interesting material: (1) from a right-hand tidal wave -- Load The Boat; (2) from twin diamonds with a right-hand center wave and all infacing points -- Load the Boat; (3) from parallel inverted lines with infacing ends -- Ends Start Load The Boat; (4) from various tidal lines, parallel lines, and parallel columns -- Single Wheel; (5) from a completed double pass thru -- Checkmate The Column; (6) from same-hand twin diamonds -- Ends Cast A Shadow, Centers Recycle (the ending formation is not a butterfly); (7) from a formation formed from infacing lines and having the centers Pass The Ocean while the ends Touch 1/4 -- Spin The Windmill Right; (8) from a static square -- All 8 Square Chain Thru.

The Sunday C-1 dance session provided the dancers with a strong workout in positioning and application of concepts: (1) from a formation formed from a trade by and having the ends Quarter Out -- Shakedown; (2) (Continued on page 5)

 from a formation formed from outfacing lines and having the beaus Quarter Right -- Coordinate; (3) from a formation formed from infacing lines and having the beaus Face Out -- All Do Your Part Follow Thru; (4) from a formation formed from parallel inverted lines with infacing ends and having the centers in the left-hand mini-waves Face In -- Tally Ho; (5) from a formation formed from a trade by and having the outside beaus and the center belles Quarter Right -- Tally Ho; (6) from a formation formed from parallel inverted lines with outfacing ends and having the left-hand mini-waves Hinge -- (Start Phantom) Tally Ho; (7) from parallel ocean waves -- Stretch Trail Off; (8) from a tidal wave -- Stretch Explode The Wave; (9) from a formation formed from infacing lines and having the centers Pass The Ocean while the ends Left Touch 1/4 -- Concentric Recycle; (10) from a right-hand tidal wave -- Concentric Turn Thru; (11) from outfacing lines -- Concentric Shakedown; (12) from outfacing lines -- Concentric Chase Right; (13) from twin diamonds with a center two-faced lines and all outfacing points -- Centers Work As Couples All Regroup; (14) from a tidal wave -- Relay The Shadow, Boys Interrupt After The Cast Off 3/4 With A U-Turn Back; (15) from a formation formed from a tidal inverted line with the very ends with right hands in and having the centers Switch To A Diamond while the ends Hinge -- Little; (16) from a right-hand 1/4 tag -- Scoot & Plenty, Interrupt Before The Split Circulates With Explode The Wave; (17) from an "I" with the ends in single file with right hands in and with centers in a right-hand ocean wave -- Ends As You Are All Plenty.

Those dancers that attended all of the sessions agreed that the Sunday C-2 dance session was the most challenging. Mike expanded on some of the material he used at the C-1 session and included more applications of concepts: (1) from outfacing lines -- Rotate 1/4 and Rotate 1/2; (2) from an eight chain thru -- Rotary Rims Trade Shazam; (3) from a tidal wave -- Stretched Wave Lockit; (4) from parallel lines with girls as centers and parallel lines with girls as ends -- 1/2 Crazy Girls Kick Off; (5) from parallel inverted lines with infacing ends -- 3/4

Crazy Split Trade Circulate; (6) from infacing lines -- 3/4 Crazy Vertical Tag Back To A Wave; (7) from a formation formed from infacing lines and having the ends Extend -- Reverse 3/4 Crazy Recycle; (8) from a completed double pass thru -- Once Removed Turn To A Line; (9) from a tidal column with all dancers facing the center of the set -- Tandem Once Removed Touch 1/4.
